Know all men, that on this third day of September A.D. eighteen hundred and seventy four, On the foregoing petition of Solomon F. Nebquid and others praying that a partition may be made of certain lands belonging to the Herring Pond tribe of Indians, and it appearing that due notice has been given to all parties interested to appear and show cause against the same and a full hearing having been had thereon it is decreed that partition be made of said lands as prayed for in said petition among the several persons named in the schedule hereto attached it appearing that said persons have equal interests in said lands. And that C. S. Whittemore of Landmark and Nathaniel Henckley of Barnstable two disinterested persons be appointed Commissioners to make said partition and that they be required to make partition of said lands in equal shares to all the persons named in said schedule, first giving notice to all parties interested of the time and place of their meeting to make said partition by publishing notice thereof in some newspaper published within the County of Barnstable three weeks at least before said time of meeting.

Pursuant to the foregoing decree and a subsequent appointment of Ezra S. Pope in place of C. S. Mittenius resigned, the undersigned have attended to the duty therein assigned them and have made partition of the lands belonging to the Herring Pond tribe of Indians, and have set off the same by notes and bounds to the several persons named on the list annexed to said decree (with this in case of decease) first having given notice of their meeting to make said partition, in the Cape Cod Gazette a newspaper printed in Sandwich in the County of Barnstable as required by said decree, as follows:

To Adriana Amos (since married to a Thompson) Adriana Amos
 No. 56 of the 3rd lot, situated Southwly of corner stone monument 12 1/2 rods thence North East by No. 57 eighty two rods thence South by No. 45 thirty two rods, thence West by No. 55 eighty nine rods, and thence N. 15 E. by Miller and Disdale thirty three rods to the place of beginning containing seven acres; also No. 63 in 3rd lot bounded as follows: beginning at a stake and stone by the Half Way Pond road thirty four rods Northwly of stone monument thence Northwly by the road 2 1/2 rods, thence East by No. 64 about 77 rods, thence Southwly by a road about 2 1/2 rods, thence West by No. 62 about 78 rods to the place of beginning containing nine acres; also one other tract situated on the road leading from Cedarville to Hyman's bounded thus, beginning at a pine tree near said road thence S. 80° W. 77 1/4 rods to Herring River, thence Northwly by the river about 13 rods, thence N. 80° E. 32 rods by survey and upland set to Deborah Dawwell, and 38 1/2 rods by said set to Nathan Fletcher till it comes to the road, thence Southwly by the road 13 1/2 rods to the first named bounds containing about five and one half acres being No. 2 of the Blackwell lot.

Conant, Easterly by land set off to Nathan Fletcher, Southward by land set off to Deborah Duggell and Westerly by Herring River, it being No. 8 of Blackwell's old No. 100.

 East 36 rods by No. 40 1/2 set to David J. Parker to the
