Joseph T. Peace and Richard L. Peace, Commissioners appointed by Hon. Theodore S. Mayhew, Judge of Probate for Dukes County, under authority derived from Statutes 1870, chapter 213, having been duly sworn to a faithful discharge of duty, and having given public notice of their appointment, have made and completed a division of the common and undivided lands of Cape Head, among all the inhabitants of that town, adjudged to be entitled thereto, and have made careful and correct descriptions of the boundaries and assignment of each lot in the division, and have also examined and defined the boundaries of those lots held or claimed by individuals of which no satisfactory record evidence of ownership existed.

In accordance with the almost unanimous desire of the inhabitants, the Commissioners determined to leave the cranberry lands near the sea-shore, and the clay in the cliffs undivided, it being, in their judgment, impracticable to make a division that would be, and continue to be, an equitable division of the cranberry lands, and of the clay in the cliffs, owing to the changes continually being made by the action of the elements.

The numbers refer to a map — made under the direction of the Commissioners — accompanying this Report, which is respectfully submitted for the consideration and approval of the Hon. Court of Probate for Dukes County.

The lots of common lands drawn, or assigned to the Commissioners Joseph T. Pease and Richard L. Pease, duly appointed by Hon. Theodore G. Mayhew, Judge of Probate for Parkes County, are numbered from N° 189 and upwards, in regular order. Lots N° 1 to N° 173 inclusive are run out and bounded under previous provision of the statute. The records of these lots will be found in Land Records 49 Book pages 114 to 198, inclusive.

Lots N° 174 to N° 189, were run out and bounded afterwards, by the Commissioners who made partition of the clean Common lands. The description of these lots, their boundaries and ownership are here given.

feet to a bound; then continuing on the same course to the waters of the At-
lantic Ocean; then by the same, northwesterly, until it comes to the range of a
wall of the South Head Place; thence following the line of the said wall, which is
quite irregular, until meeting the point of commencement.
